My madness is that I want to be sure that the replacement part, once received and installed, will make the air conditioning functional again - then the Lodge will convert the system to the boiler for heating.



Lodge Repairs/Replacements

As noted in the October Newsletter, the Lodge had a new steam table but could not use, as it required a larger amperage circuit than what was existing in the Social Quarters. The Lodge wants to thank Bruce Pickett for providing a new appropriately sized electrical circuit for the steam table. In addition, he re-wired and changed the circuit breaker of the previous outlet for the old freezer so that the new “used” freezer (purchased in May 2018), so that the electrical cord of the freezer will again be plugged into an outlet that is behind the freezer, and not exposed for someone to accidently remove from an electrical outlet.

A “pet peeve” of the Administrator, since taking office, has been the nonoperational exterior lighting fixtures around the Lodge building. Two electrical vendors have looked at this situation; but no resolution was determined. Bruce Pickett had volunteered to investigate and determined that power is being provided to the lighting fixtures (however, the timer is questionable). The LOOM Board of Officers had authorized Bruce to proceed with repairing/replacing the exterior lighting fixtures around the Lodge building. All 9 lighting fixtures were replaced (LED type with photocell sensors) and operational on October 26, 2018.

It was decided that the LARGE pothole outside the entrance of the kitchen would be repaired by cold patch before the cold weather sets in; in lieu of obtaining the services of an asphalt company making a permanent patch repair. The Lodge wants to thank Bruce Pickett for volunteering in repairing the pothole. For the record, Bruce had to use a sledge hammer to break up the three bags of cold patch that were previously purchased at least 1-1/2 years ago and stored outside the building. At least 10 additional bags of cold patch had to be purchased to complete the task.

In case a member has not come to the Lodge recently, the air conditioning had become dysfunction at the beginning of October. It was determined that the actuation motor needed to be replaced by our regular HVAC vender. The replacement motor has been ordered. Repair will be detailed in the December Newsletter.
