

The Bar Extension Project

All the thinking and calculations for the bar extension and the "foundation" structures for the bar were completed in August. The first installation in the project was two ceiling fan smoke eliminators with light fixtures (provided by a commercial company with future maintenance cleaning requirements) to compliment the two existing ceiling mounted SmokeEaters. Next came the relocation, from the Lodge Hall storage room, and installation of the donated (*going to be demolished in an office building so we disassembled and brought them back to the Lodge*) wooden cabinets, granite top, and shelving along the back wall of the extended bar. It should be noted that a strip of carpet had to be removed beneath the cabinets, and that one top shelf section has not been installed at this time because of the interference with the existing bar. Electric outlets were then installed in the cabinets and the shelves (finished and operational). While all this was going on the foundation structures for the new bar were "tweaked" a little more, some counter supports, and the finishing materials were finalized and purchased. Further advances for the bar extension will occur in October.

The Lodge knows that the bar extension project is taking longer than expected; however, it should be stated that the labor for this project is strictly on a volunteer basis and can only be accomplishment when the individuals have available "spare time" (not withstanding the time spent to perform planned Lodge activities).

Lodge Repairs/Replacements

How do the gremlins know when someone has some savings for “a rainy day”? Just after getting the air conditioning operational again last month with the replacement of the compressor, the hot water heating system became dysfunctional. One of the hot water Heaters, both connected in tandem, began to have a “waterfalls” leak situation. This became a serious situation; as hot water is a health issue for cleanliness in the operations of the Social Quarters. Since both hot water heaters within the system were beyond their expected life expectancy, both were replaced within September 2013.

In case you have not noticed, the weather over the years has affected the structural integrity of the flag poles at the front of the building. To correct this situation and provide a better presentation for the Lodge, appropriate action had been taken to have the flag poles re-secured to the building to maintain a vertical position, to have all the poles modified to be of identical height, and to have all the pole top ornaments and hoist ropes replaced. On another subject, the security alarm system of the Lodge building was inspected and will be upgraded for better security operations and alarm indications.

Heart of the Community Program Logo

Community Service has been an ever-growing portion of the overall Moose fraternal program ever since its inception under the name “Civic Affairs” by then-Director General Malcolm Giles in the late 1940s. The kaleidoscope of all that is Moose Community Service was organized into a “Five-Point Program” in the early 1990s, then expanded in mid-decade to the “Six-Point Program” including Youth Sports, Youth Awareness, Scouting, Spinoza Bear, Yellowstone YCC, Local Volunteerism, Senior Citizens, Food and Shelter, Mooseheart and Moosehaven. In October 2007 the Community Service Program grew yet again and included donations to the Tommy Moose program, the Safe Surfin’ Program, Special Olympics, and Moose Alert.

That familiar logo has grown yet again. As of August, 2013 the Moose International Six-Point Program Logo was replaced with the Heart of the Community program logo shown below. The new program is layered with more weight given to support the core programs which are nearer the programs center.



The official site of the National D-Day Memorial is located in Bedford, Virginia – the town suffering the highest per capita D-Day losses in the nation. This Memorial honors the Allied forces that participated in the invasion of Normandy on June 6, 1944 during World War II. With its stylized English Garden, haunting invasion tableau, and striking Victory Plaza, the Memorial stands as a powerful permanent tribute to the valor, fidelity, and sacrifice of D-Day participants.

During the holiday season, thousands of luminaries will shine in recognition of Overlord's fallen and in tribute to the ultimate sacrifice made by the 4,413 men that were killed to relight the lamp of freedom. The luminaries can be purchased in honor or memory of anyone, D-Day veteran or not. Each luminary costs \$20 or 6 luminaries for \$100; all gifts are tax-deductible and all proceeds benefit National D-Day Memorial operations and other programming at the Memorial. Moose Charities

Moose Charities was founded in 1994 and approved for operation in September of 2000, Moose Charities is a registered 501(c)(3) charitable corporation. Moose Charities is the non-profit, fundraising arm of Moose International with the purpose of:

1. Providing funding for the capital needs and operational support of the fraternity's Mooseheart Child City & School, and Moosehaven City of Contentment.
2. Securing funding from Moose members and friends through periodic direct mail appeals, company matching gift programs, tribute contributions and other giving opportunities including planned giving donations such as wills and bequests, charitable gift annuities, stocks, life insurance, other appreciated securities, real estate, etc.
3. The soliciting of major gifts and other significant support from individuals, corporations and foundations.
4. Raising funds through annual giving programs such as the League of Guardians, Endowment Fund Club, Gimme 5, etc.
5. Special events such as; annual golf tournaments, motorcycle events, banquets, etc. vendor sponsored events and partnering with national cause marketing campaigns and secure added financial support for Mooseheart's educational programs through corporate school support programs.
