Moose Legion Committee to Try Something New! Football Bingo while watching the Sunday NFL Games at the Lodge Beginning September 11th

An NFL Game played at 1:00pm will be selected each Sunday as the basis for various actions during the game that initiate a bingo numbered ball to be drawn. Each player selects one of the teams in the selected

NFL game; which is written on the purchased 2-board paper bingo sheet. When a team accomplishes a specific action (e.g.: makes a touchdown or field goal, recovers a fumble, sacks a quarterback, etc.), a bingo numbered ball is drawn to be played only on the 2-board paper bingo sheet that identifies that team. The Football Bingo game continues until a player gets a marked "bingo" (5 boxes either up/down, across, or diagonal). The total money collected (100%) in the sale of the 2-board paper bingo sheets will be awarded to the player with the marked "bingo". If the selected NFL game is completed without a player getting a marked "bingo", the collected money will be rolled-over to the Football Bingo game on the next Sunday. Rules of Play will be posted in the Social Quarters by September 9, 2016.

Football Bingo is being offered to entice our members to come watch the NFL games on Sundays at our Lodge; therefore, all players must be in attendance at the Lodge during the selected game in order to play the Football Bingo game!



Children Ice Cream Social on Saturday, August 6th



Moose Your Cooperation is Required!!

As the Moose Lodge has a private club status, only members in good standing can be served in the Social Quarters. Even though you may be a LOOM or WOTM Officer, a member who comes in every day, and/or has a pretty/handsome face that should have made you a famous Super Star ... the rule of the Moose Lodge (and Moose International) is that you must show the bartender your Moose Identification Card (ID) when you enter the Social Quarters. There are no exceptions!! Please do not jeopardize the Moose Lodge by not carrying or showing a valid Moose ID when at the Moose Lodge; as penalties can be sanctioned against the Moose Lodge for violating this rule; including suspension of operations by Moose International, possible financial debt with the IRS (for back income taxes, interests, penalties & fees due to not being considered a private organization), etc.






Moose Committee have approved the purchase of an ice maker for the Smoking Bar area; expectation is that this equipment will be operational by the middle of September.
